# BUILDING MUSICIANSHIP THROUGH GAMES

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#### WHY DOES PLAY MATTER?

What happens to learning when there is no sense of play?

What associations do we/kids have with games? How can we leverage this?

## **GROUP GAMES/ACTIVITIES FOR MIXED AGES**

- (My "Piano Parties" are held once a month, with mixed ages/levels, Sunday afternoons.)
- With mixed age groups, avoid theory in favor of rhythm, ear training, performing, listening, improvisation, music history...nearly *anything* else!
- Provide food. (Or ask your students to!)

## **GAMES IN TEACHING**

Know your teaching goals.

Know the essence of the game.

Know the right time for the right game.

### MY GO-TO GAMES

- 1. Amazing Keyboard Race Practices key names. Optional: include #s and bs.
- 2. Recognizing Rhythm Patterns Aurally and Swat-A-Rhythm game
- 3. Heartbeat Charts activity Simplified rhythm dictation.
- 4. **<u>Rhythm Dictation</u>** Use cards to notate rhythms. Optional: race against another team!
- 5. Grand Staff Pass Practices note names. Mixed ages/levels okay!
- 6. Ice Cream Interval Game Practices interval recognition. Solo or group activity.
- 7. Trick or Treat Rhythm Game Practices performing rhythm patterns. Solo or group.

- Keep it simple. Choose only games that you know you want as staples in your teaching.
